Nurdle Survey

Illinois RiverWatch Network and Nurdle Patrol have partnered to give volunteers the opportunity to conduct nurdle surveys along rivers and streams in Illinois

- **a.** When you find a nurdle in these 10 minutes, immediately move on to step 2.
- **b.** If you find no nurdles in 10 minutes, skip to step 3.
- a new 10-minute timer. Continue collecting nurdles along the water line for the whole 10 minutes. Once the 10 minutes are up, your survey is complete. Collect the nurdles in a glass jar or other container for disposal and move to step 4.
- **3.** Move to the most recent highwater line. To spot a high-water line, look for darker coloration on the substrate and vegetation and debris left behind along the line. Repeat steps 1 and 2 at the high-water line. If no recent high-water lines can be seen or no nurdles are found, your survey is complete.
- **4.** Submit data either on <u>nurdlepatrol.org</u> or using the Nurdle Patrol app. Even if you do not find any nurdles during your survey, 0 is still a useful data point.



5. Dispose of collected nurdles in the trash, keeping them in a container. Disposing of them this way will help keep them from accidentally reentering the environment.
