







Effects of Bush Honeysuckle on Illinois Avian Species of Greatest Conservation Need

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
Introduction

- ➤ Bush honeysuckle (BH)
 has become widespread
 across the Eastern and
 Midwest United States
- ➤ Its invasive nature can have a significant impact on wildlife populations including forest/woodland birds



Methods

- > Avian
 - 52 point-count stations
 - 5-minute surveys
 - Visited twice (June 2018)
 - Local sunrise until 10:00
 AM
- > Vegetative
 - Average of 4 random 40m2
 plots per point count
 - BH coverage and stems




Conclusions

- ➤ In general, where there is honeysuckle presence there are less species of greatest conservation need documented
- No negative impact can be reported with current dataset
- Beneficial to remove honeysuckle
